 2) FRIDAY NIGHT 6:00 – 10:00 PM WILDLAND FIREFIGHTING
This course is a product of portions from the S – 130 (basic wildland firefighting) & S – 190 (wildland fire behavior) courses. Kentucky Fire Commission adopted this course for basic firefighting knowledge & is MANDATORY for all new firefighters. This class meets Fire Commission requirement for FC30000

3) STARTS FRIDAY NIGHT 6:00 – 10:00PM BASIC SEARCH AND RESCU E (BSAR) (3 DAY CLASS) This course is designed to provide guidance to SAR field responders on the best practices & techniques about the duties & tasks of field responders, current information on clothing & equipment, as well as details on the latest search techniques. Information on specialties such as hasty search, grid search & victim packaging & transport There will be a handson search done with this class. MUST BE PRESENT FRIDAY. <u>IF LESS THAN 20 PRE-REGISTER THIS CLASS WILL BE CANCELLED</u> <u>PPE Needed: sturdy shoes (NO tennis shoes), dress</u> appropriately for the weather.

 4) FRIDAY NIGHT 6:00 – 10:00 PM INSTRUCTOR METHODOLGY
This course is designed for company officers & other fire service instructors with the responsibility of conducting training at your department. Emphasis on teaching principles & techniques applicable to the fire service. It includes effective communication, teaching from lesson plans, with an emphasis on skills training & adult learning.
THIS COURSE MEETS FIRE COMMISSIONS REOUIREMENTS FOR INSTRUCTORS UPDATE

5) FIREFIGHTER SURVIVAL SATURDAY ONLY This course will emphasize removal of trapped or unconscious firefighters from a burning building & self - rescue techniques when the primary escape route is blocked. FULL TURN OUT GEAR & SCBA REOUIRED

NO BEARDS OR GOTEES ALLOWED IN LIVE FIRE TRAINING

SUNDAY ONLY

This course is designed to teach us how to rescue victims from a burning building. Special techniques used for rescue, OSHA 2 in 2 out regulation. This is a required class set forth by Ky. Fire Commission. *FULL TURNOUT GEAR & S C B A REQUIRED*

7) EMT CON – ED

This 2 day class will offer the 16 hours that required for an EMT or 1st responder to have for recertification by KBEMS. This class will be a combination of lecture & hands - on

8) NFA: PREPARATION FOR INITIAL COMPANY OFFICER (P.I.C.O.) The primary objective for this 2 day class is to develop a better understanding of the role & responsibilities of a Company Officer in preparing the company for incident operations. In addition, this course will help students clarify the transition from firefighter to Company Officer & the new roles relating to leadership and safety.

9) NFA LEADERSHIP II: LEADERSHIP IN SUPERVISION: PERSECTIVE IN THINKING

This course provides a foundation & framework for a successful transition by fire & EMS personnel to first line supervision by exploring a broad spectrum of perspective in thinking. This 2 day course presents the student with basic Leadership & Supervisory knowledge skills and the tools needed to perform effectively in fire & EMS environment.

10) BASIC HANDS - ON OF FIREFIGHTING This 2 day course is primarily hands –on training. Topics covered will be fire extinguisher, PPE, salvage & overhaul, forcible entry, hose nozzle & appliances, ropes, ladders, victim search & rescue. <u>FULL TURNOUT GEAR & S.C.B.A. ARE</u> <u>REOUIRED</u>

11) YOU PICK IT (NEW) This 2 day course is a NEW twist on the "hard to get hours". Show up to class with a list of training hours you need and whatever topics have the highest need of those attending class will be the topics covered except for HAZ – MAT AWARENESS & OPS., & ANY FIRE COMMISSION CLASSES

12) BASIC FIRE CHAPLIANCY (NEW) This 2 day course includes course material designed to introduce the fire chaplain to ministry in the fire service. Topics include: Ministry to Firefighters, Ministry to Fire Victims, Critical Incident Stress, Fire Dept. Funerals, Fire Chaplain Operations, and many others

13) TRAUMATIC INJURY EXTRICATION (NEW)

This is 2 day class will cover unique & unusual extrication from a ring stuck on a finger, to someone trap in a HVAC vent, to someone impaled with a sign post. This class will bring NEW perspective to this type of incident. Instructors will provide " out of the box" ways of thinking that are usually not incorporated with normal fire service operations. THIS IS A HANDS – ON CLASS STUDENTS WILL NEED SAFETYGLASSES, HELMET, TURNOUT COAT & WORK GLOVES

14) FIRE BEHAVIOR / FIRE CONTROL This class is 2 day of LIVE FIRE TRAINING.

Saturday we will be doing vehicle & helicopter fires. Concentrating on strategies & attacks.

Sunday will be Flashover Survival & Recognition

15) I C S 400

This class will explain how a major incident poses special management challenges and the circumstances in which Area Command is established. It will describe the circumstances in which a multiagency coordination system area established.

16) CAUSE & ORIGIN FOR OFFICERS (NEW) SATURDAY ONLY

This class is designed to provide a clear definition of the Fire Official's role in origin & cause investigations. Course topics will include: scene preservation and protection, request for assistance from the Fire Marshal's Office, KRS-KAR, reports& scene documentation.
